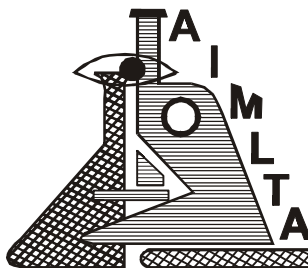

General Secretary Report, Discussion & Member Opinion :

Mr. A.N. Sinha, General Secretary, AIMLTA presented his report before the CEC and provided printed copy of the same to all participants and association activities, produced below :-

It is glorious occasion for the All India Medical Laboratory Technologists Association to celebrate its Central Executives and State Secretaries, AIMLTA meet at Kolkata with the active support of Mr. D.K. Chakroborty, State Secretary, AIMLTA State Unit, West Bengal and Mr. S. Mukhopadhyay, National Executive of West Bengal State, AIMLTA and it is my proud privilege to present before you the General Secretary Report of AIMLTA, highlighting every detailed activities of the association with specific demand before the Central Govt. (Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India) for early formation of COUNCIL for Medical Lab. Technologists of India with specific position i.e. **"RIGHT TO PRACTICE THE PROFESSION"**.

Due to advancement of Medical Laboratory Technology in India and abroad and globalization of Medical Technology the Association inter into international arena and affiliated to International Association of Medical Laboratory Technologist (IAMLT), Thun, Switzerland subsequently to IFBLS, Canada (International Federation of Bio-Medical Laboratory Sciences) and became the active member of Asian Association of Medical Laboratory Scientists (AAMLS), Japan. The association is also N.G.O. members of World Health Organisation (WHO) and making all round efforts to streamline the Medical Laboratory Technology and its quality control for better Primary Health Care system in the country.

Now AIMLTA is a professional association and an "Apex Body" of Medical Lab. Technologists of India which is working hard in the best interest of Medical Lab. Technology and technologists of India. Our main object is to foster cooperation and mutual assistance among Med. Lab. Technologists for all round development of their socio-economy and academic status in Medical and Health services and proper recognition of this profession through "Statutory Body" i.e. Council for Medical Lab. Technologists. This association undertake various social welfare health programme to serve the poor section of society by and large and coordinate with National and International agencies which are working in Lab. Medicine field with its objective "Health for all".

Association network wing is spread up right from Kashmir to Kanyakumari and state units have been established in all most all states of the country and further on to constitute new state units in uncovered area of the country.

According to recent data available with the association the total strength of Medical Lab. Technologists in India is about 5.80 lacs (Five lacs eight thousand) working in Govt., Semi Govt., Public and Private Sectors and association is persuading them to join this professional association for their bright future and right placement in medical profession. Up till now (from 1971 to March 2017) more than 41500 (Forty one thousand five hundred) Med. Lab. Tech. have been registered as member of the AIMLTA out of which total strength of life member including student member is 27950 (Twenty seven thousand nine hundred fifty). The most important development in recent days is NRI Medical Lab. Technologists attraction towards AIMLTA. Large No. of NRI and Med. Lab. Technologists working outside country are registering their name as Life member of AIMLTA such membership on-line registration is increasing day by day. Member from UAE, KSA, Qatar, Bahrain, Nepal, UK, USA, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, Canada, Bhutan are seeking information for membership on our website exceeding more than 2950 (Two thousand nine hundred fifty) & more than 1150 (One thousand one hundred fifty) registered which is remarkable achievement for AIMLTA. For all these prospect. AIMLTA has submitted a National Policy Draft (NPD) to the Union Ministry of Health and F.W., Govt. of India and also to different State Govt. Health Ministry for maintaining uniformity with regard to recruitment promotion, pay structure, job description, hazards risk allowance, non-practicing allowance, training and job oriented refresher course, opening of MLT Training Inst. at National Level and many other social and technical programmes have been placed before the govt. for consideration.

Council for Med. Lab. Technologists - At present before association, vital issue is council for Med. Lab. Technologists of India for which we are persuading since 1984-85. Central Council Bill 96 of 2007 and Amended Act "Allied Health Professional Central Council Act 2007" and NCHRD Draft Bill 2009 could not took its shape and ultimately Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India came with N.C.H.R.H. Bill No. LIX-2011 and suggestions on the Bill have been sought by the parliamentary standing committee on Health and Family Welfare. Now new Central progressive Govt. has come up and we have submitted a comprehensive memorandum to Respected Shree J.P. Nadda, Hon'ble Union Minister of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India. Vide letter no. AIMLTA/GS/820/2014 dt. 20.11.2014 to revive the Central Council Bill 96 of 2007 and amended Act "Allied Health Professional Central Council Act 2007" and presently **"The Allied and Healthcare Professional's Central Council Bill - 2015"** may kindly be introduced in Parliament for its enactment. Currently during 2016 we have submitted "Reminder Memoranda" to the Union Ministry of Health and also to Health Secretary, Govt. of India vide AIMLTA/GS/368/2016 dated 11/11/2016 (Copy enclosed) and met delegation to Hon'ble Union Health Minister as well as Health Secretary and apprised them with the burning issue of Council matter and we got assurance from Health Ministry vide letter no. Z-28016/02/2009-AHS(Pt)/FTS 148841 dated 05th Dec. 2016, Nirman Bhawan, New Delhi (Copy enclosed).

We have been assured that Bill will be placed in Rajya Sabha during winter session of parliament. However High Power Council Formation Committee will take further authentic steps and will meet delegation in May, 2017 in Union Health Ministry and subsequently in July, 2017. Now let us hope that we achieve our goal on time.

Academic Activities of the Association : AIMLTA is dedicated and to committed for the development of the MLT training programme in the country and it has introduced various MLT training programme to produce skilled and technically qualified personnel in the field of Med. Lab. Technology to cope the growing demand of trained Med. Lab. Tech. in the fast growing health care system and national health programme of the country. Academic Board, AIMLTA is playing a key role in training programme and has introduced one year and two years DMLT courses and PGDMLT for student members and in-service members through its recognized affiliated MLT training institutions in different states of the country and every year 1200 to 1350 MLT trained personnel are passing out successfully to manage pathology labs in govt. and non-govt. organization. Apart from this short terms refresher course and CEP programme for the members of the association have also been introduced under Academic Board, AIMLTA. This training programme is very fruitful for medical lab. professionals.

For professional skill and for quality assurance, the association is also considering the vital aspects of Accreditation of Laboratory functioning in India in accordance with W.H.O. programme, Union Ministry of Health and F.W., Govt. of India has offered and invited our association to start various Public Health Programme under Public-Private-Partnership. Recently we have received a reminder and offer from Union Ministry of Health and F.W. Govt. of India for **P.P. Partnership** but association will participate in all these programme only after formation of Council for Med. Lab. Technologist. Even then to serve and help the poor section of society, Association has organized various health camps (pathological investigation for Diagnostic Treatment) including Blood Donation Camp in different states and also organized scientific seminars and workshop for development of Med. Lab. Technology and Technologists of India. State units have been given matching grants from central fund for all such events. Bihar, Chandigarh, U.P., W.B., Karnataka, T.N., Delhi, M.P., Maharashtra, Tripura have organised conference, S. Seminar and workshop in their respective state.

1. Purchase (By sale deed) Office No.-150 (First Floor), K.K. Business Centre, 19 Veer Savarkar Block, Shakarpur, Delhi-110092 on 12th Feb. 2015 at the cost of Rs. 21,06,760 for the Regd. Office of AIMLTA.
2. A high power council formation committee will be constituted to take up the issue with Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India for early formation of council for Med. Lab. Technologists at national level with provision of Right to Practice the Profession.
3. G.B. House approved and accord sanction to constitute a high power council formation committee of AIMLTA to take up the issue with Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India, New Delhi and sanctioned fund of ₹50,000/- (Fifty Thousand) for council work.
4. The post of Editor and Internal Auditor will be nominated and appointed by the Central Executive Committee inviting application from the bonafied member of the association and not by election. Accordingly AIMLTA constitution will be amended. This resolution was placed in the G.B. House (41st AIC & SS, AIMLTA, Aurangabad, M.S.) on 24th April, 2016 and passed it for its implementation.

5. RE-constitution of Editorial Board headed by Dr. Satya Nand Choudhary, Editor, Chronicle.
6. DMLT Spl. Exam fee for member will be ₹2500 instead of ₹1100.
7. ₹500/- (five hundred) per month was sanctioned to General Secretary, AIMLTA for his office guest etc. which has been raised to ₹1,000 (one thousand) per month from financial year 2016-17.

"THE ALLIED AND HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONAL'S CENTRAL COUNCIL BILL - 2015" Suggestions & Comments furnished through feedback on dirahs-mohfw@gov.in

The vital issue "Formation of Council for Medical Laboratory Technologists of India" alongwith others came into existence by introduction of Central Council Bill No. 96/2007 in Parliament and finally with the recommendation of Parliamentary Standing Committee on Health and Family Welfare the bill (Council Draft Format 2007) Allied Health Professionals Central Council Act-2007 was just on the verge of concurrence. But unfortunately, it could not be implemented and instead of that Govt. proposed NCHRH Draft Bill- 2009 (Bill No. LIX-2011) which was total injustice to the cadre of Medical Lab. Technologists of India and others.

Now, we are happy that again the long awaited council Bill "The Allied and Healthcare Professional's Council Bill 2015" has come up and valuable comments and suggestions have been invited and likely to be placed in Parliament for its enactment without any further loss of time.

Hence some of the important comments and suggestions are placed before the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Health and Family Welfare and Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India for kind consideration and implementation.

1. Silent feature of the present Bill indicate that individual committee for each category of professional will be constituted. In this regard it is emphasized that there should be a separate Council for Medical Laboratory Technologists of India. After The Nursing & Doctor's community. Medical Lab. Technologists are in very large number (millions) at national level.
2. There should be a single Medical Lab. Technologists Council for all Diploma (DMLT), undergraduate, graduate, postgraduate and Doctorate degree holder like that of Doctors and Nurses.
3. Council must be headed by the professional itself of the same faculty as per M.C.I. and Nursing Council of India. As the Jurisdiction of the Council will be at all India level comprising of all states and Union Territories of the country, the dignitaries for the Council must be elected only from the national level association and democratic pattern must be followed while constituting our Council and the same may also be followed for State Council.
4. As the council is for the Lab. Professionals of entire India, only a national/state level professional association (like All India Medical Lab. Technologists Association) must be taken in to confidence while framing clauses/laws/bylaws to protect the various interests of the profession.
5. All pre-qualified in service/in practice and retired Lab. Technologists must be treated illegible to get registration in the council and the post-qualified individuals must be considered only with required qualification as per the council's norms. This was accepted and adopted earlier when M.C.I. was constituted. All L.M.P./D.M.P.s were duly registered.
6. "Right to practise the profession"

To practice a profession is a fundamental right to every professional. It must be protected by this newly constituting council in case of Medical Lab. Technologists also.

In present technologically accredited era, most of the Pathological Investigation/ Analysis is performed on most sophisticated Computerized Analyzers.

In all most all Patho-Diagnostic Centers (Govt./ Corporate Sector) this computer generated data is derived by a well trained Lab. Technologist of the organization and forward to the Clinician.

Clinician is the authority (not the Pathologist, who are less than 1% of the national requirement & gathered mostly in urban area of the India) who finalize the diagnosis considering various important factors such as - Clinical Complaints, Radiological Reports, ECG/ Trade Mark finding & Scanning etc.

Thus in the process of Medical Lab. Technologist is the most important link, who is considered authentic to generate the reports & sign independently, by the Health Authority of State / Central/ Corporate field, & to deliver the reports to the concern Physician directly. Then the same is to be accepted statutorily to practice the profession out of organization.

Due provision must be made to legalize the Lab. Practice done by Technologist's, introducing protecting laws & by laws, by the incoming Council of Med. Lab. Technologists of India.

7. It is also suggested and emphasized that the Rajya Sabha, Department Related Parliamentary Standing Committee on Health and Family Welfare 31st Report on Para Medical and Physiotherapy Central Council Bill 2007 presented to the Rajya Sabha on 21st October, 2008 may please be considered and taken into account while finalizing the Council matter. Most important Para-Medic replaced by "Allied Health Professional and Paramedical be replaced by Allied Health Profession and the word Technician be replaced by Technologists. Hence Nomenclature "Technologists" may be used in place of technician.
8. All India Medical Lab. Technologists Association (AIMLTA) Reg. No. S/12081 is the only Apex Body of Medical Lab. Technologists of India having its branches in all most all States and Union Territories of the country and large no. of skilled Medical Lab. Technologists working in Govt., Semi-Govt. and Private Sectors have been registered working for development in the Patho-diagnostic technology. A REGISTER is well maintained and Govt. should consider it valid for registration in the proposed Council. At the same time AIMLTA is also dedicated and committed for the development of the MLT Training Programme upto Diploma Level in the country through its Academic Board, producing fully skilled professional in the field of Medical Lab. Technology to cope the growing demand of trained MLT in the fast growing health care system and National Health Programme in the country which require systematic approval from Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India to run the Academic Board, AIMLTA for success of DMLT Training Programme.

AIMLTA (Reg. No. S/12081) is the only Apex Body of Medical Lab. Technologist of India, the oldest and first organisation of Medical Lab. Technologist having more than 5 lacs members spread over in all States and Union Territories of the country. Hence, it is our specific demand before the present progressive and dynamic Central Govt. to constitute the Council for Medical Lab. Technologists with right to practise the profession without any further loss of time and kindly ensure the progress into this specific demand. 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

Regarding Income tax : Filing of Income tax return every year by General Secy. Banks are deducting the TDS every year. TDS statement from banks have been taken.

State Activity Payments : The payment is made to the State Secy. for the the state activity. The State Secy. may apply for the funds as per state Life Membership strength. Besides this those who are organising the Scientific Seminar, will get the financial add of Rs. 15,000/- every year.

AIC & SS : Last year we have organised 41st AIC & SS at Aurangabad, M.S. As per previous years the organising committee could not generate donation and hence we have paid about Rs. 13,01,466 lacs. Against delegation fees of Rs. 8,76,500. We have resolved that the host state should generate 25% donation amount of the expenditure but nothing has been done in this respect.

Purchase of Delhi Office : Recently we have purchased the long pending mandatory requirement of own Registered Office at Delhi. Due to delay we have to pay Rs. 21,06,760/-.

The space we could get is about 150 sq.ft. office cabin in Shakkarpur area. Congratulations to all of you and members for own registered office at Delhi. Now the Delhi state unit has to bear the responsibility to maintain the Delhi office. For purchase of this office we have to withdraw one FD of Rs. 17,70,000/- premature and hence the fix deposit amount is reduced to above amount. We will try to make up within few years.


Regarding accounting of receipt and payment : I will request all concerned officials to put up the voucher within one month after expenses were made. Proper voucher of payments should be submitted to G.S. office within time. Financial year ending March, hence all vouchers should be submitted to G.S. within 30th of April. So that accounting and Audit work could be done in time. For this co-operation from all of you is requested in coming years.

Receipt and payment statement submitted for approval in case of excess of payments made more than the budget allocated because the budget was as previous year number of student in case of AB. This year the number of student increased and hence more examiner required for examination caused increase in examination payments. But in case of association the CEC & AIC expenses are increasing the organizing authority can control by monitoring committee.







I welcome you all on this event and convey my best wishes and respect for the whole Executive and special invitees present here in the meeting under the auspices of our Honorable President and General Secretary. I extend my deepest gratitude to our generous President Mr. Dhananjay Kumar Singh. He is 'Leader of Men' and platonic axiom. On this sensitized moment my heart exceedingly is full of sincerest affection, greatest reverence, highest veneration and admiration for our honorable General Secretary Mr. A.N. Sinha. Dear Sir, your fidelity, fraternity, administrative capacity on common ground is remarkable which you have perceived in your long tenure in the association. You possess the spirit of co-operation and your emotional attitude and affection with the members always encouraged to do the work which is right of which we are proud. You have set up an example before us that age is no barrier to do the work in right direction. My dear friends, every new day brings the hope of a new life, therefore, face the waves mentally and surmount them like strong swimmer, with that hope AIMLTA and its Academic Board continue to develop and prosper.

After brief introductory remarks, it is a pleasure for me to submit the report of AB endowed with glory and grace:

(A) ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES : The AB meeting was approved and held at Patna Head Office on 22nd and 23rd Oct., 2016, mentioned following objectives :

- (i) EXAMINATIONS :** The examinations of one year and Final year DMLT was conducted from 28th June to 2nd July, 2016 and Final year PG DMLT from 30th Aug. to 3rd Sept. 2016. No underneath untoward happenings had been noticed during the period of examinations.
- (ii) EXAMINERS :** A total of 65 examiners have been appointed for conducting all sets of DMLT examinations. I should congratulate all the examiners on the excellent work which they have done in conducting the examinations with good attitude and integrity.
- (iii) STUDENTS :** A total of 1217 students are qualified in all courses of DMLT examinations from 65 institutions respectively.
- (iv) QUESTION PAPERS :** Three set of question papers reviewed, moderated, printed and kept confidential in the custody of Controller of examinations. Sealed answer books were allotted to concerning examiners as per requirement of the centers respectively.
- (v) EVALUATION :** The sealed answer books was received by the controller of examinations, distributed by the controller for evaluation, examined by the expertise as per provision of AB rules and regulations, obtainable marks was configured in the office of controller. The practical and theory marks were tabulated and progress card prepared under the supervision of controller. The DMLT Results was verified and confirmed in AB meeting for declaration and execution. The marks sheet and diploma certificates awarded to the students had been received by the institutions in the month of November-December 2016.
- (vi) BILL - VOUCHER :** While submitting TA / DA bill, examiner should be careful about the consideration of their bill - vouchers as per AB norms. I have over and over again requested to you to mention Rly. mileage in your bill and address in block letters with Pin Code as well as Mobile numebr but it was not followed by you which creates problems for me for execution.
- (vii) REMUNERATION :** All kinds of remuneration are being remitted by Academic Board to the concerning payee. No claim of the subject is awaiting in AB. The mode of payment was made either by cash or cheque whichever bring possible according to circumstances.
- (viii) FEE STRUCTURE OF THE STUDENTS :** Taking into account the pecuniary circumstances the inference I have drawn that the continuing increase of Rs. 100/- per Student per year to be reviewed. Subject to this, it was being asked by the directors of the institutions that how long it will be succumbed. This issue needs further discussion and discernment.

(B) ACADEMIC CREDENTIALS OF THE INSTITUTIONS : The academic session has ended with its several achievements. The overall progress in academies year by year and academic acclamation of the institutions for the year 2016 is recorded by Ab shown in Table and Figures 1, 2, 3, 4, 5). 



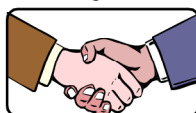
